FROM the KEYBOARD of PASTOR KATE

For your thoughtful reflection, consideration, and conversation with others --

What is faith, and why is it important?

Martin Luther once wrote, "Faith is a living, daring confidence in God's grace, so sure and certain that you could stake your life on it one thousand times. ... Through faith, a person will do good to everyone without coercion, willingly and happily; serving everyone, suffering everything for the love and praise of God, who has shown such grace." Faith, then, is not about intellectually agreeing to a set of beliefs but about living in a trusting relationship with God in response to God's grace. Faith is our confident hope that living in God's promises sparks renewal to love and serve neighbors, as God in Christ loves us.

What is a congregation?

A congregation is a community of faith that gathers for worship, fellowship, learning and service. It's a place to find connection with others as you experience and share God's love and grace together and grow in faith and fortitude as a disciple of Jesus Christ.

Faith Practices – Living Our Baptism

We are living in unprecedented times. There is much that we cannot control, but we can control our choices of behavior. **Now is the time to intentionally choose healthy patterns** to offset the isolation, grief, lament, polarization and negativity related to these times.

Healthy choices include faith practices. Our Affirmation of Baptism (ELW, p. 237) provides five faith practices to integrate into our daily life. The Holy Spirit uses these, along with prayer, bible study, caring conversations, and rituals and traditions, as gifts to teach discipleship, stir the embers of faith, create bold leaders, and transform congregations to be communities of Jesus where there are life-changing relationships with God, one another and the world. Communities of Jesus are intended to be life-changing. Vitality comes as our spirits become alive in Christ through faith practices, each meant to be received as a gift from God. Five faith practices we name in our Affirmation of Baptism are to —

- Live among God's faithful people;
- Hear the word of God and share in the Lord's supper;
- **Proclaim** the good news of God in Christ through word and deed;
- **Serve** all people following the example of Jesus;
- **Strive** for justice and peace in all the earth.

Every Sunday in worship ELCA congregations hear God's word from the Scriptures, pray together and come to the Lord's Table expecting to receive the mercies that the Triune God promises.

Throughout the week ELCA members continue to live by faith, serving others freely and generously in all that they do because they trust God's promise in the Gospel. In private devotions and small group studies, at the side of the sick and lonely, as we accompany those in need and in our daily work, this faith saturates all of life.

The Holy Spirit uses the Scriptures to present Jesus to all who listen to or read them. That is why Lutheran Christians say that the Scriptures are the "source and norm" of our teaching and practice. Despite the diversity of viewpoints and the complexity of the many narratives contained in the Scriptures, Lutheran Christians believe that the story of God's steadfast love and mercy in Jesus is the heart and center of what the Scriptures have to say. We are being equipped to live and serve in the world with all its complexities, tensions and ambiguities with God's grace and truth.

I encourage you to take the time to do a spiritual self-assessment:

- How often am I showing up and participating in worship and fellowship with my faith community?
- When and in what ways am I being nourished through the Scriptures?
- Do I take personal time with God each day?
- Where am I using my spiritual gifts to benefit and support others in Jesus' name?
- When was the last time I invited someone to join me for worship or bible study & a meal?
- When was the last time I connected with my pastor about my relationship with God and my spiritual needs?

These questions are meant to be considered in conversation with the Holy Spirit. They are also helpful for conversation with me and/or other faithful, trusted disciple of Jesus. You are meant for abundant life -- to be growing and flourishing in your relationship with God and with God's people. Don't go it alone!

"Dear Grace Lutheran Friends.

We want to thank you for your generous offering sent our way after the fire. Your gift and those of many others are certainly helping us get back on our feet.

The fire destroyed our home and almost all of our belonging. Neither Pansy nor I were injured in the blaze. (Other than a low grade burn on my left arm which has healed nicely). Thankfully, some neighbors and fire fighters were able to rescue a couple of important file cabinets and some "sentimental" items. The Monticello community (and many persons from the nearby towns including Darlington, New Glarus and Monroe) have been extremely kind, generous and helpful. Our church has offered a good deal of assistance, and since we are searching for a new pastor, the church board has invited us to occupy the church parsonage for a few months. So we are now back in the home we lived in from 1996-2014.

Another positive note: There is a new home being built in Monticello. In its 1300 square feet are three bedrooms and two bathrooms. And it has no steps. Not a large house by any means, but certainly adequate to meet our needs. It will not be finished until sometime in August, but this could work out well for us.

Again we want to thank you and many others for your generous support which has helped to sustain us through this unforeseen turn of events. I have never hesitated to say that "in the end is NOT the quantity or our possessions that is most important; but rather, what remains most important is the quality of our relationships—with God and each other."

We are now experiencing firsthand the truth of this statement such that our gratitude outweighs our loss

"Dear Pastor Kate:

We have had another successful tax program this year. Without a place to meet and serve taxpayers, we would not been able to prepare returns for the largely low-income and elderly community in Lafayette County. We had six sessions in Darlington and two in Argyle with some extra days for pick-up of prepared returns.

Our service levels were similar to last year. We assisted 136 taxpayers (including spouses) by submitting 118 tax returns. Assuming an average commercial cost of \$150 to prepare a return, we saved our taxpayers \$17,700. In addition, the total state and federal refund amount was over \$96,000.

The basement of Grace Lutheran is perfect for our purpose. I am sure you are aware how important your space is to the tax assistance program. Please pass on to the Council and the congregation the gratitude from our program and the taxpayers."

LETTER FROM SOUTH-CENTRAL SYNOD OF WISCONSIN re: APPLE GROVE

Dear Partners in Ministry,

As you are likely already aware, Apple Grove Lutheran Church, a congregation of the South-Central Synod of Wisconsin (Green/Grant/Lafayette Conference), was destroyed by a tornado on Saturday, June 22.

Below is an update from Pastor Dan Bohlman, including information about how you can help the congregation as they begin the process of clean-up and recovery.

It is with great love that our congregation at Apple Grove says thank you to everyone who has reached out with prayers, concern for us, and offers to help both physically and with financial gifts.

Our initial need right now is to work on our cemetery. We have somewhere in the area of \$30,000 damage. We want to make sure that the tombstones are picked up and restored to their footings.

With the needs of the cemetery in mind, if you would like to give a donation to help restore our cemetery, you can send a check written out to "Argyle-Apple Grove Lutheran Church." The mailing address is: Yellowstone/Argyle-Apple Grove Lutheran, Box 217, Argyle, W 53504.

If donations exceed the final cost of the cemetery repairs, the extra funds will be placed in a special account and will be used by the church to cover expenses not covered by insurance.

We again want to thank everyone for your love and support as our church journeys through this difficult time. We are so blessed that you are taking some of the burden off of our shoulders.
